Farewell to Prominent Resident, Jane Mehaffey

Long-time Pinehaven resident (since 1983, with a few stints elsewhere), Jane Mehaffey left us on April 21 2025. Her adventurous life with her husband, Tom Halliburton, was well celebrated by a large gathering at the Royal Wellington Golf Club in Heretaunga. The photograph of Tom and Jane on their trusty tandem bicycle sums up the adventurous spirit that motivated their immense treks across the USA and Europe, including the UK.

Jane was first elected onto the PPA Committee at the 2006 AGM and re-elected another eleven times, the last time in 2017. Jane and Tom organised grants for replacing the Pinehaven Hall roof, a project completed in January 2008. She was also actively involved with Playcentre.


Jane was deeply committed to blindness advocacy, contributing at both local and national levels through her involvement with several organizations. She was Co-ordinator for the Wellington branch of NZ VIEW Inc (Vision Impaired Empowering Women) for many years. On several occasions, she served as National President and as Vice President. She was a committee member, secretary and branch representative of Blind Citizens NZ Wellington Branch.

Jane was an avid indoor bowler. A highlight of her year was attending the annual National Blind Indoor Bowls Tournament at Labour Weekend.

Jane left behind her husband of 43 years, Tom; sons Carl and Jacob; her granddaughter Natalie; and an extended family stretching across six countries.
